



#### **Two Principal Regulators**

#### **Environmental Regulator**

- Drinking Water Quality Supervision & Reporting
- Waste Water Discharge Licensing
- Urban Waste Water Compliance Reporting
- With powers to prosecute Irish Water for any compliance failures





#### **Economic Regulator**

- to protect the customer interests by monitoring the performance of Irish Water
  - in delivering services and providing investment in water and wastewater infrastructure in a cost efficient manner.
  - ensure consumer prices for water are fair and reasonable
  - resolving complaints that customers have with Irish Water

#### **Advisory Body 1**



#### **An Fóram Uisce (The Water Forum)**

Between 20 and 40 members representing stakeholders

- to advise the Minister in relation to water policy having regard to water conservation, rural water services and the interests of the customers of Irish Water
- to make recommendations to Irish Water in relation to the performance by of its functions, and when requested on any policy document prepared by Irish Water
- to advise and provide observations to the CRU in relation to the performance by Irish Water of its functions and on any consultation document prepared by the Commission
- to advise in relation to any river basin management plan and implementation of that plan, on matters pertaining to the objectives of the EU Water Framework Directive, and on such other related matters concerning the management of the inland aquatic environment and water resources;

#### **Advisory Body 2**

### An Comhlacht Comhairleach Uisce (Water Advisory Body)

- 5 persons (1 each from CRU, EPA & Water Forum plus 2 appointed by the Minister)
- to advise the Minister on the measures needed to improve the transparency and accountability of Irish Water for the purpose of increasing the confidence of members of the public in Irish Water
- to furnish, on a quarterly basis, a report on the performance by Irish Water on the implementation of its business plan with particular regard to:
  - (i) infrastructure delivery and leakage reductions;
  - (ii) cost reduction and efficiency improvements,
  - (iii) improvements in water quality,
  - (iv) procurement, remuneration and staffing policies,
  - (v) responsiveness to the needs of communities and enterprise.
